

# Ideas for Short Walks around Tadcaster - Number 1

## Inholmes Lane and the Riverbank

Two and a half miles : an hour or more ...  
Pack – picnic and blanket for the riverbank

From Tadcaster Bridge walk into the main street and take the first right up Kirkgate. The road bears left at the church and you will soon pass the swimming pool on your right. When the road takes a sharp turn to the right, go straight on up Station Road. Pass Coors Brewery on your right and when you get to the fire station turn right up Inholmes Lane.

Follow the lane to the top, go through the gate and follow the path, keeping the fields on your left. Keep the fence on your left when the path takes a sharp left turn. (Do not take the path on the right.) Shortly the path will cross the old railway line.

Go through the metal stile into the field and follow the path to the main road. Cross the road and take the stile to the left of the main gates and into the field. Go through the gap in the trees, down to your left, and follow the path to where you can turn left upstream to Newton Kyme. However, you need to cross the concrete stile and keep straight on.

After a few hundred yards you will go through a short tunnel under the abutment to the old Healaugh river bridge. Follow the riverside path back into Tadcaster, passing under George Hudson's impressive viaduct: this was intended for a rail line to York which was never completed.

Follow the route clockwise :
